



ONE OF THE LARGEST CRYPTS IN EUROPE

20 centuries of history A 30-year old excavation An exceptional site spanning 870 m².

The Archaeological Crypt of Notre-Dame du Bourg offers a unique overview of the urban and architectural evolution of Digne-les-Bains throughout the centuries with its display of archaeological remains discovered during excavations carried out between 1987 and 1993. Twenty centuries of history have been revealed thanks to the remarkable conservation of the site.

1980 saw the start of large-scale renovation work to save and strengthen Notre-Dame du Bourg Cathedral. A preliminary archaeological excavation inside the building interior was rapidly deemed necessary to further ensure its restoration (1987-1988). A large place of worship was discovered among the first finds, showing evidence of liturgical use perpetuated from the 5th to the 11th century. These highly promising results led to extended researches on two other sectors outside the cathedral. An ancient settlement in the Bourg area corresponding to the origins of the town of Dinia with ancient walls (1st to 3rd century) was the firstto be discovered, followed by a first Christian church (late 4th century/early 5th century) and lastly a 5th century basilica which was enlarged in the 7th century and then again in the 11th century before being replaced in the late 12th century/ early 13th century by Notre-Dame du Bourg Cathedral.



Generally speaking, a crypt is an area built under a church to house the bodies of martyrs in order to hide them from the eyes of the unholy. In this case, the word 'crypt' which comes from the Greek 'Kruptos' means 'to hide' and does not

1987-1988

Initial archaeological excavation inside the cathedral led by Gabrielle Démians d'Archimbaud of the laboratory [LA3M], Aix-en-Provence;

1991

Second excavation, outside on the north side of the cathedral;

1993

Third excavation comprising the entire forecourt of the cathedral;

2003

Prefiguration of the crypt by Francesco Flavigny, Chief architect of historical monuments;

24th june 2010

Inauguration of the archaeological crypt.

Open from April to October Wednesday and Saturday 10:00 am to 12:00 pm From Tuesday to Saturday 02:30 pm to 06:30 pm


CLOSED

HOW TO GET TO THE CRYPT

By Car

GPS coordinates: N: 44° 05 829′ E: 006° 14 543′

From Digne-les-Bains town centre take Boulevard Gassendi for La Javie/Barcelonnette. After the big fountain go straight on for 300m and you will come to Notre-Dame du Bourg Cathedral at the end of Avenue Sainte-Douceline. The car park is behind the cathedral. When you are on the forecourt, the ticket office for the crypt is on the left-hand side of the cathedral.
